Abstract: We can give your dog a "vaccine" injection - that makes the dog's immune system attack an enzyme, the fifth enzyme that supports the itch response in the skin.

There is a way to remedy itching in dogs that are good candidates for it.

And this remedy requires a shot (vaccine) every 4-6 weeks during 'allergy season'

It won't work if the pet has:

- Infection in the skin.
- Mites in the skin.
- Fungus / yeast in the skin.
- Steroids on board. Steroids are shutting down the immune system but you're asking it to work.
- Apoquel on board. Apoquel is shutting down the immune system while you're asking it to work.

It <u>will</u> work if the pet has ATOPY and severely itchy skin WITHOUT disease in the skin. And that's a LOT of dogs.



Cytopoint STIMULATES the immune system instead of depressing it. That's why it's better than cortisone AND better than Apoquel.

We simply assess the skin to intercept complicating skin diseases that would interfere with Cytopoint's effectiveness.

If the pet seems "immune-competent" (isn't sick or really old) then we administer the Cytopoint injection.

In some cases, as fast as 6 hours you may see a decrease in itching. The shot can last up to 6 weeks, sometimes longer, sometimes a bit less. It can be repeated as needed monthly.
